2022 WVC Conference Welcomes More than 12,550 Attendees to the Veterinary Industry's Premier

The WVC 94th Annual Conference was a resounding success.

LAS VEGAS, NEVADA (March 22, 2022) — The WVC 94th Annual Conference, the veterinary industry's premier yearly event, hosted more than 12,550 attendees at Las Vegas' Mandalay Bay Convention Center, March 6-9.
