

WVC 94th Annual Conference Safety Protocols Q&A

Will WVC be an in-person conference March 6-9, 2022?

Yes, Viticus Group is moving forward with all aspects of our in-person conference March 6-9, 2022. We expect to hold all educational sessions, entertainment, and Exhibit Hall activities as planned and there will not be a virtual option available this conference.

What safety measures are in place to mitigate risk?

The safety of our team members, conference attendees, and company partners are our number one priority so we once again will have multiple safety measures in place to ensure a safe environment for all attendees. While proof of vaccination and/or negative test results will not be required, the safety measures listed below will be in place (subject to change based on federal/state/local mandates).

- In accordance with the Southern Nevada Health District, masks are required for all people indoors.
- Our friendly Security Team will be politely reminding participants to wear their mask while inside.
- All individuals must walk past temperature monitoring cameras located in multiple areas prior to entering rooms to verify they do not have a fever greater than 100.3 degrees F.
- HVAC control and air filters that meet or exceed recommended standards.
- Increased cleaning schedules for common areas and high-contact touchpoints.
- The use of disinfectant sprayer technology nightly in event spaces.
- Additional room space throughout the event space and hotel.
- Frequent hand sanitizer stations and enhanced cleaning measures.
- Contactless check-in.
- Plexiglas dividers in high-volume check-in areas and additional staff to assist with food service.
- Mandalay Bay Convention Center has achieved the Global Biorisk Advisory Council (GBAC) STAR accreditation, the gold standard for prepared facilities.
